From the Principal..

In last weeks newsletter we included a number of photo examples of the different work being done by students in the same classroom. For teachers that's called differentiation – or making sure the learning is different according to the year level being taught and the needs of the student.

There is another way to differentiate and it's about the learning experience itself.

One of the motivation opportunities for us is the gorgeous outdoor spaces we have available to us, particularly at this time of year and with the understanding that some learning is better done outside the classroom in an environment where students feel safe, happy and engaged. Our primary students have been participating in this type of learning through their gardening and cooking activities on a Friday afternoon, on a regular basis over the last 12 months. While out in the garden, students are challenged to apply their knowledge of looking after and growing vegetables in the garden as a team. They have been required to cooperate, to work with their peers in a fair and constructive way, build relationships and consider the thoughts and feelings of others as they work together.

It was great to see both younger and older students outside yesterday beginning the early stages of our work on the farm. Class I went outside with Mr O'Toole and did a virtual tour with some exploration of the spaces that will be used to plant and grow hazelnuts and saffron. An older group of students went outside a little later in the day to work on the demolition of some small, previously used sheds. This group had more of an opportunity to focus on the things they know, understand and value about themselves as they get to know Mr O'Toole and they got to know him. The discussion while they worked was child centred, friendly and encouraging. Some discussions are clearly much better done in smaller groups and away from the classroom.

Mrs Quinn and I are attending some professional learning this week that is all about changing the way we teach and harnessing the active and dynamic minds of our younger learners. Play based learning is all about empowering students to learn, inquire and understand the world around them. The classroom teacher facilitates engaging and stimulating learning opportunities, supporting students to consider what it is they already know, what it is they would like to know and how they might do this. Play based learning is often described as inquiry based learning, where children have the opportunity to direct their own learning. This type of learning opportunity very naturally supports being in a variety of different learning spaces, including outside.


I encourage parents to discuss with students not only what they were doing at school today but where they were doing it and why they think they had to learn that. Perhaps the best question is to ask students what learning they did today that did not come from being at a desk in a classroom?


















CATTLE HILL WIND FARM COMMUNITY FUND COMMITTEE


